The Rosary in 1916

"Ireland's Loyalty to Mary" a book by Fr. Augustine OFM and published in 1952 has many interesting examples of the place held by the Rosary by those who fought in the Rising one hundred years ago. The following are some examples from that book.

Joseph O'Connor at Boland's Mill: "On Wednesday night I was able to relieve one section that moved into a railway shed for food and sleep. After a while I looked to see if they were sleeping and was surprised to find them all recitng the Rosary, the section commander giving out the prayers and the others responding."

A Man on the roof of the GPO: "I don't know how we escaped - the enemy fire was unceasing and their bullets and shells seemed to fall everywhere except on us, though some of the lads took all sorts of risks. There is only one way I can account for it - the Rosary was recited by some one of us in turn almost every half hour of the four days and four nights we were on the roof."

Julia Grennan describes a scene just before the surrender: "A number of men gathered in the back drawing room (of the house in Moore Street) and knelt to say the Rosary - a picture I will never forget. They knelt, holding their rifles, soon to be surrendered, in their left hands, their beads in their right. Tears ran down many a cheek and the responses were said chokingly. We then marched out. The GPO was still burning firercely. On board ship on the way to prison, in prison, on the ship back after release, the Rosary was recited repeatedly. Seán Heuston, just before his death knelt at his table saying the Rosary. Major McBride, just before his execution, gave Fr. Augustine his rosary and said: 'give that to my mother'."
