As a group we attended the Blessing of the Sick. It was marvelous to see the sick being wheeled by so many young people. It made me grateful for my own health.

Monday, our last day, we had Mass in the Sheepfold in the City of the Poor. Some went to Gavarnie for an afternoon in brilliant sunshine and sight-seeing. On our final evening we went to say goodbye (or *au revoir*) to Our Lady, putting all your petitions at her



feet and lighting our Candle, so that, as we left, the light of our candle would continue our prayers as we came home. We had such a large candle that it needed a trolley to bring it from the hotel to the Grotto.
