### Our Jubilee Celebrations

While all the exciting preparations are continuing for our  $60^{th}$  anniversary of the opening of St. Gabriel's Church in 1956, this week we have another celebration.

When the church was built it was a 'Chapel of Ease' in the parish of St. John the Baptist, Clontarf Road.

Ten years later, on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1966, St. Gabriel's became a Parish Church in its own right. That's fifty years ago this week!

Fr. Michael Murphy was transferred from Halston Street to become our first Parish Priest. The two curates at the time were Fr. Christopher Mangan and Fr. John Baker (who co-incidentally in later years became a young Fr. Pat's first Parish Priest).
