St Gabriel's Bringing Irish & Syrian Teenagers Together

Made possible by your generous donations to our Refugee Fund, St Gabriel's is spearheading a youth project this summer to bring Irish and Syrian teenagers together through the medium of art.

In co-operation with Youth Work Ireland, the Canal Communities Regional Youth Service, the Amal Women Association and the Islamic Foundation of Ireland, a two-week art project will bring together teenagers from Clontarf, three local youth services (Bluebell Youth Project, The Core Youth Service and Rialto Youth Project) and young refugee Syrians (14-16 year-olds) for two weeks (last week in June, first week in July).

Young people in the Syrian community in Dublin struggle with isolation, finding it difficult to make friends or connect to community activities. These young people would benefit greatly from a facilitated opportunity to develop social connections and community ties through supported youth activities with their Irish peers and we believe that this will also be an enriching experience for our own local teenagers.
