Fr Tony Coote RIP

We are saddened with the news of the passing of Fr Tony Coote who shared his energy for life and God. Fr Tony wrote in his book "Live While You Can"



"My prayer every day is very simple. I just rest in the presence of God, particularly each morning when I am awake very early. Instead of being annoyed that I can't go back to sleep, I remember that this is probably my only private time of the whole day so I literally place myself into a presence in the darkness. It's at this time that I reconcile everything going on within me and around me. This is when I am most calm, and I hear the words of Jesus to Peter: 'Courage. It is I, do not be afraid' (Matthew 14:27). I have celebrated many funerals over the past twenty-seven years and have always sought to find the right words to comfort the bereaved and place the one who has died within a prism of hope. All those words are tumbling around inside me now, as if to say, 'Do you feel that the same thoughts apply to yourself?' It is time for me to literally practise what I preach. I feel now that I am aboard a fast train with only one stop. I'm not in a mad hurry to disembark. I'm like everyone else; I only know this world and this life, but I see no meaning in this life ending in a grave. When the train stops, I will step onto that platform with hope and no fear."

Archbishop Martin said "Tony showed all of us how strength can be witnessed even in the face of human weakness. His courage and determination touched the hearts of people of all backgrounds. His courage leaves all of us more humble. May the

Lord welcome and give him the deep peace to which he witnessed in his suffering."
