Congratulations Deacon Declan Barry

We offer our sincere congratulations to Declan Barry, who was ordained a Permanent Deacon in Swords on Friday.

The ministry of Deacon dates from the time of the apostles and is mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles and other documents of the early church. The role disappeared over the centuries until it was renewed by Vatican II which described it as a 'distinct ministry of servicer' to be exercised 'in communion with the bishops and priests'.

It takes four years of part-time study to become a deacon and most deacons work in the ministry on a part-time basis, continuing in their main career and family life.
