A Different Christmas

We are being asked not to gather in large family groups to combat the Coronavirus. People are not coming home for Christmas. There are sacrifices for everyone.

In the Church we are trying to protect people and yet prepare for the coming of Jesus . Some churches have decided only to have Mass on webcam. Here as you know, we have an extra Christmas Mass, but even with six Masses cannot cater for what we would be accommodating at one Mass in previous years. We have sent out the details of our programme for Masses and other ways of welcoming Jesus.

Next weekend we will have the blessing of the "Bambino" for the cribs. We ask you to bring the infant from your crib to the church or else have it blessed on the webcam. The suggestion is that you wrap the infant figure and place it under the Christmas Tree with all the presents. The infant is God's gift to us and should be the first gift to be unwrapped on Christmas morning. We have included a blessing for your crib on our Christmas card.
